\*Individuals, families, neighbors, descendants, churches, businesses, civic clubs, and other organizations may adopt a cemetery. Adoption includes:

- ✦ active participation April through November
- ✦ spring and fall clean-ups
- ✦ mowing and trimming every 4-6 weeks, May through September
- ✦ notifying the Historical Society of broken stones, trees or large limbs down — anything requiring more than routine grounds maintenance
- ✦ a one-year commitment, which may be extended for additional years
